The Epistle Hebrews 5.1-10

Bible 1361

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten you";

as he says also in another place,

"You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Formation Opportunities

Sunday Mornings for Adults

9:30 AM: Equipping the Saints is our lecture and discussion class that meets in the Multipurpose Room on the lower level of Heyward Hall. Led by the clergy and others, the class is a series of series, beginning with *Laughter and Humor in the Bible*. Stories of Abraham, Sarah, Jonah, and Balaam all involve the gift of humor, an essential part of human life and one aspect of the joy of the Lord that sustains us. Our teacher this week is Jason Lockhart, who will take up some of the less successful leaders in the Bible, whose efforts walk the line between comedy and tragedy.

9:30 AM: The Wired Word meets in the Parlor on the first floor of Heyward Hall. Discussion-oriented, this class works off lessons emailed to participants in advance, that provoke reflection on Scripture, current events, and our common life. 9:00 AM: The Second Sunday Early Adult Class meets TODAY in the Dining Room of the Barr Center. It is a great choice for 8 AM service worshipers. This season we study: *Drive Thru History - Acts to Revelation*. In this series of Drive Thru History, Dave Stotts explores the amazing lives of the very first Christians. Beginning in Jerusalem and using the Book of Acts as a roadmap, Dave travels the Mediterranean region to share the people, places, and events that launched the Christian faith. This class will investigate what happened after the Gospel accounts of Jesus Christ. Dave follows the lives of the disciples through Israel, and travels the missionary routes of Paul and his companions. We finish with John on the island of Patmos, and drive through the seven churches of Revelation in Asia Minor.
